



Safeguarding

- You trust us to be responsible and take care of your children whilst they are at our school, and we take this responsibility very seriously.
- Mr Preece deputy headmaster and Designated Safeguarding lead he has over all responsibility for the safeguarding in this school. To support him in this he has:
 - Deputy safeguarding officers
 - Pastoral bases
 - And every member of staff has been trained and safeguarding responsibility.



Online Safety

- We teach Online Safety in lessons, PHSE and on signage around the school
- All of the school information technology is scanned and monitored
- Personal phones are allowed in school
- One of the most important things we can do as parents and carers is to talk to our children about online safety.



Snap Chat

- Minimum age of 13
- You can take a picture or video and send it, it does not remain on the phone but disappears after 24 hours
- It also has an in app resource called snap maps
- Ghost mode hides your locations
- you can create a group chat to talk with friends or message individual friends.
- Snapchat Family Centre is an in-app feature to help parents engage with their teens



General safety information

1. Friends – are they really friends do you know them all personally?
2. Privacy – Who can see your location, address, phone number email?
3. Content – what is the age for the site/app
4. Conduct – think about what you post, many cases of youngsters expression opinions that have later caught up with them
5. Contact- do not arrange to meet someone you don't know offline
6. Commercial – be careful of online scams or online in app purchases.
